**December & January Birthdays:** We will be celebrating our December and January birthdays during snack time on Friday, December 8.

**Mochitsuki:** A sign-up sheet has been posted at the Parents' Table for this popular annual winter family social and potluck on **Sunday, December 10<sup>th</sup>, from 11:00am to 1:30pm at the Preschool (1830 Sutter St.).** The program will open with a few songs by the preschoolers and any ASP children who wish to join in the performance. The *mochi*, (sweet rice) pounding, by *Kagami Kai*, (a group including many NLF alumni families that demonstrates *mochi* pounding throughout San Francisco), will follow. There will also be an opportunity for those who wish to participate in the actual pounding of the rice to make *mochi* as well as for everyone to sample the tasty results. A delicious potluck lunch will conclude the event.

**Project Wrap Up & Holiday Party:** The K-2<sup>nd</sup> graders are working very hard to create their own world. The test run of opening their country will be on Tuesday, December 12<sup>th</sup> and the actual opening day will be on Tuesday, December 19<sup>th</sup> @ 4pm. We encourage families to check out this unique shopping experience and support an important community service organization as they shop.

**Dance Performance Fundraiser:** We will start dance rehearsals with the children for their *Dowa no Omatsuri* performance (February 25<sup>th</sup>) on Thursday, January 11<sup>th</sup>. The dance groups and practice schedule will be posted on the Parents' Table soon.
